Quizzes: There will be a quiz covering the material from the previous week every Monday. In addition, there will be a pop-quiz whenever more than 1/3rd of the class is absent. Your lowest quiz score will be dropped.

Exams: There will be an exam on **Tuesday**, **June 17th**. This exam will consist of an in-class portion as well as a take-home portion, which will be due on the following Friday. The final exam is on **Friday**, **July 4th**. You are responsible for all material in the covered sections in the book, not just material that was explicitly covered in class. Like the homework, exams will be graded primarily based on the clarity of the solution, and strict correctness will be secondary.
